

Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Statements

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The Editorial Board of Linguistica Brunensia has 11 members. They are recognized experts in the field of Slavic languages, esp. Czech language, general linguistics and historical-comparative linguistics. Nine of them are foreign citizens employed at well respected international universities or research institutions.

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- **Peer-review process:**

All papers that are to be published in section "Articles" and "Materials" are peer reviewed. Each paper submitted to the editorial office is subsequently sent to two reviewers. The peer review procedure is double-blind and consists of two parts: a personalised assessment intended for the editorial office and anonymous comments addressed to the author of the paper. Reviewers are independent of the authors, i.e. they are not affiliated with the same institution (reviewers have no conflict of interest). Reviewers assess authenticity, quality and novelty of presented data and argumentative structure of the paper. Also formal criteria such clarity of expressing, accuracy of abstract and keywords, relevance of bibliography and overall arrangement are assessed. After manuscripts are reviewed, the author is asked to revise his/her manuscript in response to the suggestions of the peer reviewers. If the reviewers do not recommend accepting the paper, it is rejected from further evaluation. Communication with editors / reviewers (incl. filling in the peer-review assessment forms) takes place via online editorial system.

The review process takes three months on average. Once a paper is accepted for publication, it is assigned to an appropriate issue depending on its topic.

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- **Publishing schedule**

The journal is published twice a year both in the print and the electronic version. The first issue is published on June 31 of each year, the second issue is published on December 31

of each year. Once a paper is accepted for publication, it is assigned to an appropriate issue depending on its topic.

The journal's name *Linguistica Brunensia* reflects its content (linguistics) and the place of publication (Brno). The Latin rendering of the name reflects the undeniable influence that Latin scholarship has had in the development of current grammatical thinking.
