

EDITORIAL

Dear readers,

The new issue of Pro-Fil comes with some good news. The editorial board of the journal has expanded. We have three new members from international philosophical community, namely Tomislav Bracanović and Tomislav Janović from the Department of Philosophy, Centre for Croatian Studies, University of Zagreb, and Friderik Klampfer from the Department of Philosophy, Faculty of Arts, University of Maribor. We are pleased they have accepted our invitation and hope their membership will contribute to further internationalization of the journal.

We are also working on the inclusion of Pro-Fil in quality journal databases. In September 2016 we succeeded in ERIH PLUS and now we are negotiating the inclusion in CEJSH and other databases.

The new issue brings three thematically varied contributions. Jitka Paitlová focuses on the early work of Karl Popper and his polemics with logical positivists on the possibility of verifying or falsifying natural laws. Radim Brázda and Zdeňka Jastrzemska have stepped back from traditional philosophical themes and taken aim at philosophy itself. In their metaphilosophical contribution they map information flow in philosophy and the dialectics of the relationship between explication and reduction of philosophical findings. Jan Čížek and his colleagues from University of Ostrava take us to the history of philosophy. They have completed a translation of the preface of the Irish philosopher John Toland's most famous work *Christianity not Mysterious* and supplemented it with a commentary on his life and work. The final brief contribution commemorates the recently deceased British philosopher Derek Parfit
